Instructions after Surgical Removal / Biopsy of Lesion / Cyst / Mole with Dressing

- 1. Keep dressing dry. If dressing gets wet, remove it, and replace with another dry dressing.
- **2.** Leave dressing in place for 48-72 hrs.
- **3.** Inspect wound at dressing change for signs of infection i.e. redness, pain or discharge. Consult your G.P. if you have any concerns.
- **4.** If bleeding occurs apply pressure to the wound with a clean towel. Reinforce wound with another dressing. If bleeding persists seek medical advice, contact your GP or South Doc, or attend your local Emergency Department.
- **5.** Return to your G.P practice for removal of sutures on -- /-- /--.
- **6.** A copy of biopsy results will be forwarded to both you and your referring doctor.
- 7. The local anaesthetic effect will last 1 -2 hours. You may be supplied with a prescription for painkillers on leaving the hospital or you may take painkillers such as paracetamol or anti-inflammatory tablets to help with any pain you may experience. Ask your pharmacist for assistance if needed
- 8. Leave steri-strips in situ until they fall off in about a week
