This passport will tell staff all about you so we will know what you like and do not like.





Part Two: Social Story Coming to Hospital

All About Your Visit to Hospital - Social Story






In the morning before your operation it is very important that you do not eat any breakfast.



Make sure to bring your completed hospital passport with you.



Please do not wear any jewellery or make up for your operation.



When you arrive in hospital go to admissions.



Admissions will ask you a few questions about yourself.



Admissions will bring you up to the ward to meet the ward nurse who will look after you.



Make sure to show the nurse your hospital passport.



The doctors and nurse will ask you a few more questions about yourself on the ward.



The nurse will check you with some monitors.

If you are **not** going to theatre, you can now go to the last page of this story



We will give you a gown and hat to put on.



You might like to relax and play with some toys while you wait to go to theatre.



Now it is time to go to theatre. The nurse will go with you. Your parent/carer will go with you too.



In theatre there are lots of people wearing scrubs.



The doctors and nurses will ask you a few more questions in the waiting room. You can ask them questions too.



The nurse from theatre will bring you in to the operating room. Your parent or carer will go with you.



The doctors and nurses will check your name band to make sure they have the right person for the right operation.

The nurse in this picture is wearing a face shield and a mask. They help us to look after you safely.



We will put some monitors on your finger your chest and your arm.



The doctor might need to put a plastic straw in your hand called Freddy.



The doctors and nurses will ask you to blow into a mask. It will smell a bit funny.



Now you will be off for a sleep.



You will wake up in the recovery room. There will be another nurse there to look after you.




When you are comfortable enough the ward nurse will come and collect you.



The porter and nurse will bring you back to the ward in your bed.



The nurse will get you comfortable in your bed and check you with some monitors again.



Now your operation is over it is time to have something to eat.



Thank you for being so good in hospital.

Your nurse will give you a bravery cert before you go home.
